Fort Atkinson Lion Cal Langholf has served as a club member for 60 years and has 58 years of perfect attendance. Cal is 96 years young and has actively served his club and community. He attended meetings regularly during the past year and conscientiously serves on committees ie. coffee preparatoin for the fish/smelt fry, conces- sion stand worker for the summer softball pro- gram and food preparation committee at the annual corn roast where over 2500 people were served in August.

Lion Cal recently experienced a fall resulting in broken bones and has spent a few weeks in hospital rehabilitaton and currently is recuperating at Wellington Meadows.

During his 60 years in Lionism Cal served in cabinet leadership positions as District A-1 Zone Chairman and Deputy District Governor. He has enthusiastically attended state and international conventions, served the Fort Atkinson club chairs and was club president in 1947-48. While serving as president he originated the idea of establish- ing an award for service to the community. He participated on the club bowling team for many years and was always willing and available to serve his club and community. In 1978 he was recognized for his efforts and was awarded the Lions Club Distinguished Community Service Award which he had created 40 years earlier. The prestigious Melvin Jones Award was pre- sented by his club in 1989-90 for his years of dedicated service to Lionism.

Cal retired from the W. D. Hoard Company as foreman of the typesetting department after being employed from 1927-1972.

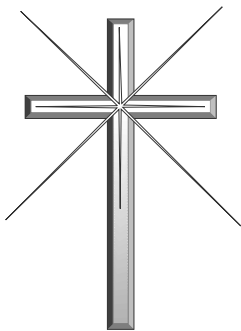

## The New Berlin Industrial Lions Club

Our club was sponsored by the New Berlin Lions Club, and started meeting in the fall of 1974. The club was actually chartered in February of 1975. We now have over 25 years of great tradition.

Our recent and on going fund raisers include the entertainment books in the fall of the year, bocce ball in the spring, and the volleyball tournament in the summer months. The club just approved Saturday March 20<sup>th</sup> as the date for our 2004 bocce ball tournament. The volleyball tournament is always held on the last Saturday in July.

Our club, with the help and support of then D.G. Bob Ahler, set up the District Golf Tournament in 1984. The scramble format that we set up is still being used in the 2003 tournament.

We brought the Lions State Curling Tournament to our District via the bid/vote system, and sponsored it several times. We participated in this tournament for years. We also introduced curling to other clubs in our district. These 27-A1 clubs are now enjoying the competition offered in the State Curling Tournament.

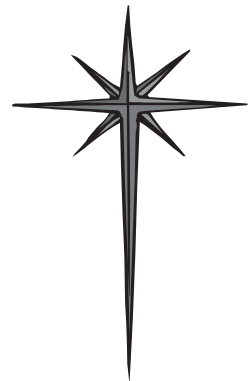
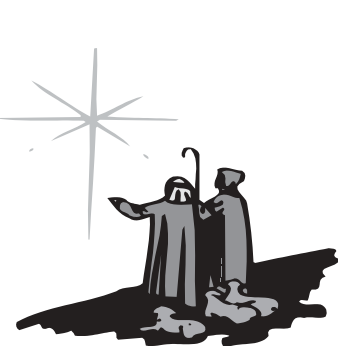

## DUES

I have been asked by a number of Lions to clear up the Dues we pay. International Dues were increased \$15.00 at the Int'l Convention in July. This increase will be spread out over three years. The totals are as follows:

- District dues are set by the District Cabinet at the first Cabinet meeting Each year. This year the Cabinet voted to raise our District Dues to \$6.00. Our District Constitution states that our District Dues SHALL BE \$3.75 per year. This article is in direct conflict with how District Dues are set and for this reason we have a resolution on the ballot at the District Convention to simply eliminate this line. The Multiple District Council of Governors sets a limit on District dues every year. That limit for 2003-2004 was set at \$10.00. Our District 27-A1 Dues were the lowest in our Multiple District 27 and this increase is a necessity if we are to continue the positive direction our proud District must follow. Your District Long Range Planning Committee and District Cabinet have approved this dues increase. I encourage your delegates to vote in the affirmative.

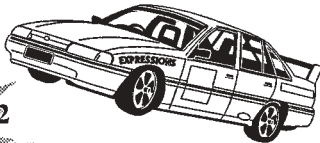
