**RESOLUTION 1**

**PURPOSE:** To change the wording in the District Constitution, Article IX, District Finances, Section 1, paragraph a and paragraph b, regarding the setting of district dues. To establish a District Dues Cap and enter it into the District By-Laws. To maintain the Delegates right to vote on a District Dues Cap.

**WHEREAS:** District Constitution Article IX, section 1, Paragraph a needs to be changed.

**WHEREAS:** District Constitution Article IX, Section 1, Paragraph b needs to be removed.

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:** That the following changes be made to the District Constitution. Article IX, District Finances, Section 1a and 1b, to be amended as follows.

**ARTICLE IX  
DISTRICT FINANCES**

Section 1.

a. The Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer shall collect approved per capita dues from the Clubs of the District for the District Administrative Fund, Multiple District, and State Convention Administration funds. The District Dues to be collected shall be determined at the first Cabinet meeting, and may not exceed the District Dues Cap set forth in Article IV, Section 1, Paragraph C in the District By-Laws.

Section 1.

b. This Paragraph to be removed.

**WHEREAS:** There is a need to establish a District Dues Cap.

**WHEREAS:** The District Dues Cap needs to be entered into the District By-Laws.

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:** That the following paragraph be entered into the District By-Laws, Article IV, District Finances

Section 1. Per Capita Tax

c. Our District Dues Cap shall currently be \$8.00 per member, per year. The District Dues Cap may not exceed the limit set by the State Council

**Now therefore be it resolved:** that the voting time listed in Article II, Section 5 be changed to read 30 minutes.

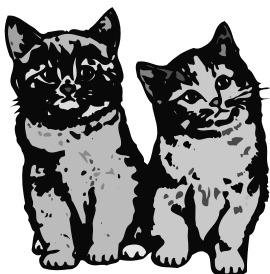

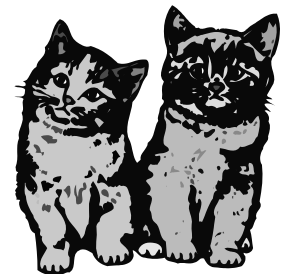
