Thank you everyone for the cards, flowers and prayers for our family with the passing of my mother Lioness Dorothy "Dottie".

On January 1st we lost a dear friend of the Lionistic family, Lioness Dorothy "Dottie" Ulfeng, after a lengthy battle with cancer.

As a member of the Elkhorn Lioness Club, Lioness Dorothy served her Club by working on different fund raising activities including the recently held afghan raffles. In recent years it was not uncommon to see Lioness Dorothy with a pair of knitting needles hard at work creating a green and gold afghan, or one of the many afghans presented to the wives of our visiting International Directors and to our District Officers. Lioness Dorothy's service to her community took a more personal emphasis since her cancer diagnosis in late 1996. With Lioness Dorothy's enthusiasm and guidance, many Lioness Clubs banded together to coordinate and participate in the Relay for Life held in Elkhorn each summer. Thousands of dollars were raised during these Relays to help find a cure for cancer.



Dottie also served the Lioness program by her work on numerous committees of the Lioness District Cabinet and as Lioness District Treasurer for 2 terms in 1995-1996 and 1996-1997. She was elected to the position of Vice President in 1997-1998 and then served as President in 1998-1999. During her term as President, Lioness Dorothy always stressed that members should take care of their health so that they could continue to serve others who were in need.

The Lioness motto "We Serve Too" seemed to always be present in everything Lioness Dorothy undertook, whether it was organizing a Relay for Life fundraiser, serving a spaghetti dinner, knitting another afghan, or traveling to another chemotherapy treatment. When discussing her cancer treatments in 1999, which included participating in experimental therapies, Lioness Dorothy remarked that "even if [the experimental treatments] don't help me, maybe they will one day help someone else to beat this." This generosity of spirit was typical of Dorothy.

Dottie shared her belief in Lionism with her husband of 16 years, Lion Ken Ulfeng, and with her children, including her daughter Lioness Brenda who, with the support of her mom, has been serving as our Affiliate District President this year.

Lioness Dorothy's motto during her year as President was "Lionism and roses are forever".

Perhaps when you see the roses start to bud and bloom each spring, you will recall Lioness Dorothy with fondness and renew your spirit of dedication to service of those in need - as she did so very often.

We share in the sorrow of loss, and will miss our dear friend Lioness Dottie.

Children's Eye Vision

Screening Project

Through the efforts of local Lions and Lioness Clubs, screenings are taking place in their local day cares and preschools. Vision problems affect one in every five school children and one in every twenty preschool age children. Hales Corners Lioness have been conducting eye vision screening within the Hales Corners community and we have 3 other Lions Clubs currently conducting photo-screening. Perhaps this is a project your Club can start to help pinpoint children with vision problems before they become permanent?

Did you know:

- 85% of a child's learning is related to sight
- When vision problems begin in early childhood, a child does not know he/she has a problem because the brain compensates for the poor vision. Therefore, the child with a vision problem won't complain, and he/she may not have symptoms that parents would notice.
- Some vision problems must be identified before the child reaches the age of five to ensure successful treatment. This is true of Amblyopia (lazy eye), which if left untreated, can lead to permanent vision loss.

Vision problems can be detected through a simple vision screening that takes less than five minutes. If a problem is detected, a professional eye examination is recommended.
