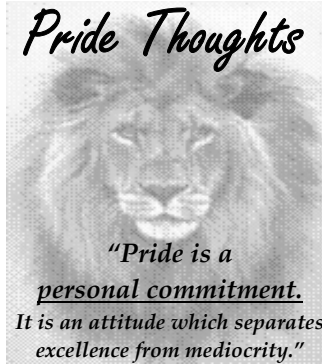

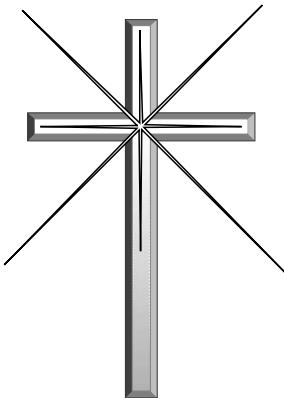
Calling all District 27A1 Lions

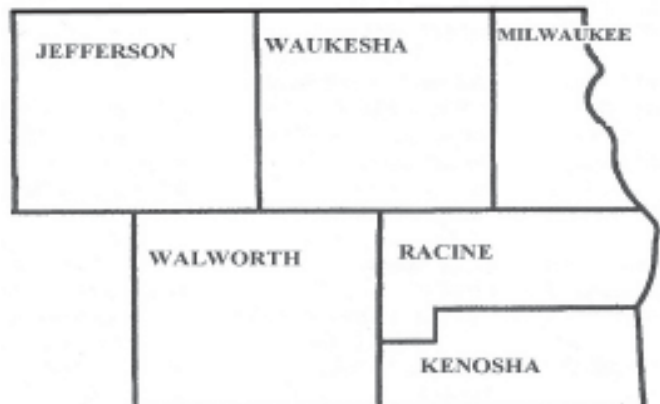

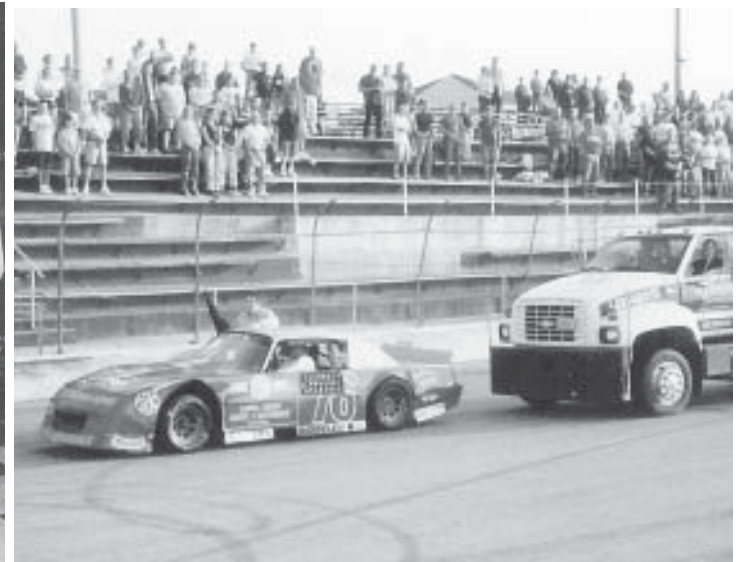
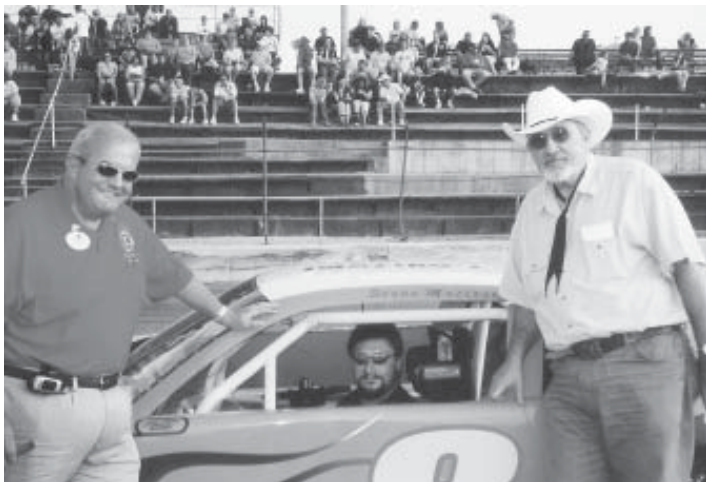
