**POLICY FOR THE DISTRICT 27A1 CONVENTION COMMITTEE
LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL
DISTRICT CONVENTION POLICY MANUAL**

1998 WC Revision:

This manual describes all policy to be followed by the 27A1 District Convention Committee, who shall be host for the 27A1 District Convention. It consists of seven Sections, all of which must be abided by. The District Cabinet must approve all specific exceptions. The District 27A1 Policy Manual directs authority to this Policy.

The Sections are as follows:

- I. Constitution and By-laws
- II. District Convention Committee and Duties
- III. Exhibitors and Booths
- IV. Convention Requirements and Schedule
- V. Distribution of Revenues
- VI. Agreement (contract) between the District and the Convention Facility
- VII. Summary

I. CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

The following is a copy of pertinent Sections of the District 27A1 Constitution and Bylaws:

CONSTITUTION – Article XI

Section I

- a. The District Convention Committee shall be chaired by the District Convention Co-Chairmen.
 - b. The District Convention Committee shall consist of the District Convention Co-Chairmen, the Vice District Governor, the District Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer, the Region Chairmen, the Lioness Affiliate President, and her Convention Chairwoman. The District Governor shall serve as an ex-officio member.
 - c. The District Convention Committee shall screen suitable sites for the next annual convention. An advisory vote, for selection of the site for the next annual convention, will be taken during the current District Convention. A final recommendation for the dates and site of the next convention shall be approved by the District 27A1 Cabinet at its next Cabinet meeting. (Example: The site and dates of the 2000 Convention should be voted (advisory) on by the District membership delegates at the 1999 Convention. The final recommendation should be made at the next District Cabinet Meeting.)
 - d. The District Governor shall be the presiding officer of the annual District Convention. The District Cabinet shall have complete responsibility for supervising all phases of the District Convention.
 - e. Any District funds expended in connection with the District Convention expenses, or District Convention administrative expenses, shall be approved by the District Cabinet as a part of the District budget.
3. Clubs and Candidates – Friday Hospitality
- a. A \$100 fee shall be charged for this area. (This amount may be revised at the discretion of the District Convention Committee.)
 - b. *In order to maintain proper etiquette for all visitors and dignitaries, refreshments shall not be distributed until the Opening Ceremonies of the District Convention have been completed.*
 - c. All rules describing agreements and manning, as outlined above, shall apply.

IV CONVENTION REQUIREMENTS AND SCHEDULE

A. SITE REQUIREMENTS

1. Housing: A minimum of 300 first class rooms, including two complimentary rooms for two nights for the early registration raffle winners, shall be provided. These rooms shall be used during the District Convention. They may be transferred to another person.
2. Meeting Rooms:
 - a. Hospitality – ballroom to accommodate a minimum of 550.
 - b. Registration – to accommodate a minimum of 250.
 - c. Seminar Sessions – seating for a minimum of 400.

 - f. Voting (2) – areas large enough to ensure traffic flow with a minimum of confusion.
 - g. Saturday (Governors) Banquet – seating for a minimum of 250.
 - h. Cabinet Meetings (2) – seating for a minimum of 75.
 - i. All District Sunday Brunch – seating for a minimum of 150.
3. *All Convention function space shall be provided at no cost to District 27A1. This is in accordance with the District Constitution and Bylaws.*
 - a. Complimentary Accommodations
 1. VIP (International Speaker).
 2. Any current International Director from Wisconsin.
 3. Lions 27A1 District Governor.
 4. Lioness Affiliate District 27A1 President.
 5. Lions Raffle Winner – early registration.
 6. Lioness Affiliate Winner – early registration.
 7. Wisconsin Lion Foundation President.
 8. Lions District Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer.
 - b. Registration, registration materials, and distribution thereof.
 1. Printing
 - a. Programs
 1. General Convention schedule and directory.
 2. Banquet program (determined by the District Convention Committee, with the concurrence of the District Governor).
 3. Necrology Service Program.
