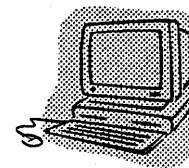
GOOD YOUTH PROJECT:

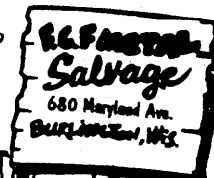
